FAMILY TALK: 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

- Gospel Focus on Luke 21:5-19: Jesus describes frightening signs of warning about the destruction of the temple. This was a way of talking about Himself. He would be destroyed and like the temple, so would the old ways.
- Reflection: Church buildings may be beautiful, but they are not the most important thing about our faith.
- At Home: Talk about what would happen if our church building were destroyed? Would you still have faith? What would that be like?

What a wonderful opportunity we had on World Mission Sunday to unite with the Holy Father and Catholics around the world – all gathered at the Eucharist – to recommit ourselves to the missionary task of our church! Your local archdiocesan Mission Office wishes to thank all who made personal sacrifices to donate to the Holy Father’s Society for the Propagation of the Faith.

STANDING OR KNEELING?

In the Spring of 2003 we were given a new “*General Instruction of the Roman Missal*.” In that instruction we were told the appropriate posture during Holy Communion is standing. The Communion Procession is a profoundly religious action. We are the Body of Christ, moving forward to receive the Christ who makes us one with Him and with each other. Standing as everyone receives is a sign of this unity. However, because of the longstanding practice of individuals returning to their places to kneel or sit in private prayer after receiving Holy Communion, this provision has caused some controversy. In an effort to clarify the situation, Cardinal Frances George, Chairman of the Committee on the Liturgy, wrote to Rome. He received a response that it was not the intention to regulate posture so rigidly such that those who wished to kneel or sit would no longer be free to do so. Many churches never got around to asking people to stand after Communion. St. Thomas More was only doing what we were asked to do. **The bottom line is: Please feel free to kneel or sit after Communion if you are more comfortable in doing so.**
