Training and Calendar Updates

Scoutmaster Moment

As we get closer to Summer Camp, I thought now would be a good time to give you some helpful information.

During Summer Camp, the boys will be very busy, but may have some moments of homesickness. This generally will occur at night, when they have some time to reflect on their day. It is critically important for parents to use the weeks leading up to their Camp stay to let them know how much fun they will have. Please refrain from telling the boys that you will miss them (even though you will), as they will become fixated on that fact and will become more homesick. Every year, there are boys who become "homesick", and we want to assure you that we have successfully helped the boys deal with this issue without the need to call home.

Summer Camp is one

of the many steps toward adulthood, in which the boys learn their own coping mechanisms. Their success in this will bring forth new-found confidences that will serve them well as they follow their scouting career.

There is a "No Electronics" policy for camp, therefore, boys are not to bring electronic equipment to camp, this includes cell phones. (IPODS may be used during "off times" - as long as they do not include a phone/email). Electronic devices can lead to distractions and may cause injury.

Additionally, it is important to make sure the boys start/end each campout/event from the troop hall – no exceptions. BSA rules and insurance require this and all scouts must help load/unload the supplies used at the campout. Parents who help transport the boys must make sure they are



"cleared" by the scoutmaster for transportation of any scout before/during/after the campout. This is for the safety and protection of the boys.
